Stats (last 12 months)

One year ago today we had 63 cats & 17 dogs, for a total of 80 animals. Today we have 71 cats & 28 dogs, for a total of 99 animals.

- We were actively working to keep our numbers low in anticipation of our renovations.
- If we appear a little cranky in the spring/summer, it could be because our total animals went from 77 on Jan 1st to 145 on Aug 1st. This is due to kittens, kittens, kittens.
- Please spay/neuter your animals! If you have unfixed cats, keep them inside. Please do not contribute to the overpopulation.
- Sadly, animals are staying longer in our shelter. Comparing the last few years, average stay went from 30 days in 2020, up to 42 days in 2021, 49 days in 2022 and 53 days this year. All shelters are at capacity and the pet supply is far greater than demand.

Spotlight on Keno – 459 days waiting



Could it possibly be true? How can a dog that is as wonderful, loving & happy as Keno remain in a shelter that long? Keno came to us at just 9 months old in Aug 2022, and just had his 2nd birthday here on 11/22/23. Keno has never known a stable environment! The original people who surrendered him to us got him off Craigslist.

They had him just 1 week, but said he was showing signs of aggression to their other dog. Keno's coat was bad & he had fleas. Since he's been with us, he's had 3 tries at foster/adoption, none lasting more than 2 weeks. Keno does fine with meeting dogs, and even plays with them, but seems he doesn't want to share his home with them. (I can relate with my friends!) Keno loves so very deeply, that he feels he needs to protect his person. He needs an owner that will teach him that this is not necessary, and they will be the leader. He will take time to feel comfortable in a home with other people coming to visit. He just needs to be taught how to be a dog! Due to his needs, he must be an only pet, in a home with no kids. Keno is just perfect here at the shelter, and we're all in love with him. We're hoping his person is out there! We know if you come in & meet him, you'll fall in love too!

Volunteers Wanted!

Do you need to get out more? Be more social? So do our animals! Would you like to walk dogs, or work with timid cats? Would you consider becoming a routine volunteer one day a week? All of this helps! We are at capacity, and any additional quality time the animals receive helps them be healthy, well adjusted, and get adopted! We also have regular volunteers who come in & take our dogs out on 'doggie days' which could include hiking, or maybe just grabbing a burger from Mickey D's.

We can't wait for the day that we don't recognize this old building anymore. We are looking forward to a roof that doesn't leak, cleaner air, even heat & cooling, easy to clean surfaces that are free of diseases, special quarantine areas, safe/secure outdoor kennels/fencing, the list goes on. Now they are in a shelter, not understanding, stressed, and having a difficult time. A couple of them are seniors, Clancy is 15 years old! Some were very timid and only used to their owner. They have come a long way with people but would do best in quiet homes with patient owners.
